

CHAIR REPORT

It is with pleasure that I write my first report as Chair for Judo NSW, and I would like to take the opportunity to thank the membership for your trust in the Board to run Judo NSW to benefit our members.

MANAGEMENT & GOVERNANCE

The 2022-23 year was a time of organisational change for Judo NSW. Our previous Chair, Nic Lowe, stepped down as Chair in October 2022. We want to take the opportunity to thank Nic for his passion, time, enthusiasm, and energy over the past seven years. It hasn't gone unnoticed or unappreciated! Rumour has it, there's a black belt and coaching in the not-too-distant future for Nic, so we certainly haven't lost him to the sport.



Along with a change in Chair, we also changed our CEO. Beck Hamilton moved on to the CEO role for Judo Australia in January 2023. It was the first time we had a CEO from outside the sport, and Beck's way of looking at the sport differently challenged us and got us out of our comfort zone. Beck's thinking challenged us to do some things differently to benefit our members. Beck's legacy was to educate us that we can learn from others and other sports, and this gave us the confidence to bring in another CEO with a wealth of SSO - but no judo - experience to take the reins. Greg Helm joined us at the beginning of the calendar year and was in the thick things with exposure to the Sydney International Open within the first weeks of joining. Greg's many years of experience in sports management will hold us in good stead. Whilst he may not be a judoka, he has been on the mat and is building a knowledge of the sport. He's eager to meet as many of our members as possible, so don't be afraid to introduce yourself to him at any stage.

OUR PERFORMANCE

While the past twelve months have seen a consolidation in the sport as confidence post-pandemic has grown, our member participation numbers have struggled to grow since 2019. Many sports report the same challenge as people's engagement with sport was challenged when unable to train. Much of the focus for our local clubs has been building back up the sport's profile and attracting new members to turn this downturn around. Member participation has always, and will always, be one of our most significant challenges and opportunities

The good news is we continue to attract new people to the sport; the challenge is keeping them in the longer term. This is where coaches and clubs play a vital role. Building a 'family' within clubs and ensuring a product/service that keeps athletes stimulated, challenged, and engaged are the club-level remit.

For Judo NSW, it's about providing a 'community' across the sport, ensuring our coaches are skilled and knowledgeable to teach judo, and providing opportunities and activities across the community that individual clubs would struggle to provide. For the past 12 months post-pandemic, much of this was about going back to basics. It was great to see the number of coaches gaining their accreditation grow, new referees coming into service, and more members testing their abilities in varying levels of competition.

Like all businesses, we have unfortunately experienced increased costs coming out the back of the pandemic. During the extended COVID-19 lockdowns, we were fortunate to leverage additional government grants and some of our financial reserves to support members at the club and individual levels. Unfortunately, the additional grants did not continue this year, which meant that we ran at an operating loss for a second year.

OUR UNSUNG HEROES

Our sport runs on the backs of volunteers. We rely on their generosity, and I would like to take this opportunity to thank them wholeheartedly on behalf of all our members. We are not a financially 'rich' sport, so we rely on volunteers to run many of our clubs, our state organisation, and our events. We have our regular contributor's year in and year out, but like most sports post-pandemic, we struggle to have enough people to help us daily.

Volunteering not only provides value to those who receive it but also to those who give their time. Whether it's helping to develop such skills such as "working under pressure" when refereeing, "attention to detail" when timekeeping at a tournament, or "organisational skills" in organising an event at your club, or "financial management skills" at a club committee/board level; there are many opportunities to gain a vast array of skills and knowledge through volunteering. We certainly value the help, so if you are in the market to build new skills, please speak to your local club or Judo NSW, and we'll happily provide opportunities for you to grow.

Highlights from FY2023

Tournaments:

The introduction of the Community Series in 2022 provided a series of events which were aimed at increasing competition opportunities for all levels of Judoka. The 2022 Series saw four events held at Blacktown and Coffs Harbour and attracted just over 900 entries.

The 2023 Sydney International held at the Quay Centre, Sydney Olympic Park was a highlight for the events calendar in FY23 and was an amazing spectacle for those who attended. Quoted as being one of the largest Judo event that has been held in Australia, over 600 athletes competed over two days in Shiai, Kata and No Limits events.

High Performance:

We have seen remarkable progress in our athlete HP development programs, nurturing the talents of our young judokas and providing a clear pathway for their growth. I thank the NSW State Coaching Team who assisted over the past year conducting monthly training sessions as well as the intensive 6- week of squad sessions in the lead up to National Championships.

Our elite HP athletes have continued to excel at the national and international levels, representing Judo NSW with pride and distinction with results that can be viewed in this annual report.

Governance and Compliance:

We have worked diligently to ensure compliance with all relevant regulations and standards, fostering transparency and accountability within our organization.

Sustainability:

While we were able to achieve a small increase in total registrations, the sport continues to have a high churn rate losing approximately 40% of membership each year. However Judo NSW has seen a slow upward trend in membership growth that we hope to see continue into future years with more focus on these activities.

Looking Ahead to 2024:

As we move into the next year, we are excited about the prospects for Judo NSW and will be focused on;

- Continuing to strengthen and expand our NSW State HP Development and Hub opportunities.
- Increasing collaboration with Clubs to expand capacity to grow our tournament offerings and membership.
- Retention of existing members and reducing churn rate.
- Investing further in our Coach education pathways to increase the number of accredited coaches and upskilling opportunities for existing coaches.
- Exploring innovative ways to make Judo more accessible and inclusive to a wider audience.
- Emphasizing good governance practices and responsible financial management and sustainability.

In closing, I want to thank the entire Judo NSW community for your continued support and dedication. Together, we will achieve our vision of a thriving Judo community in New South Wales. I look forward to the journey ahead and am excited about the incredible potential that lies before us.



NSW KATA COMMISSION

WORLD KATA CHAMPIONSHIPS (POLAND, SEPTEMBER 2022)

Last year, two teams from Judo NSW attended the World Kata Championships in Krakow, Poland (Sep 2023).Bernhard and Bjorn Tandean competed in the U23 division of Katame no Kata, and were able to successfully come away with a Bronze medal, the first Australian medal at this IJF event. The second team were Yekaterina and Alexander Malinowski, who competed in the open division of Katame no Katame.

NATIONAL KATA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Judo NSW Kata Team fielded 13 pairs at the 2022 JA National Kata Championships, Gold Coast, QLD. The coaches were Dale Keogh and Ernie Wakamatsu. Team manager was Marcus Trupple.

The Kata team took five of the possible 17 medals; two Golds, two Silvers, and one Bronzes. While the team performance was good with some stiff competition from QLD, there is some concern about the national Kata judging level.

Of the medalists, the Bernhard and Bjorn Tandean team will go onto the World Kata Championships in Abu Dhabi (Oct 2023) to compete in the open Katame no Kata division and try to earn another medal at this level. We look forward to their continued success. While the highlight of the Kata team is their performance at the Nationals. They also competed at the Canberra, Sydney, and Melbourne International Opens in the lead-up to the National.

The 2024 team selection competition is the Sydney International Open and the Judo NSW State Titles events. The team is urged to compete at the Canberra International Open.

- 3. Introductory online and club referee training

We look forward to continuing this program and developing an outcome-oriented training and development strategy.

- Discuss opportunities with NSW grading to introduce mandatory state C referee grade for Shodan (attending at least 2 Calendar events as a referee). (Carried forward action)
- The NSW Referee Commission will continue monitoring, encouraging participation, and developing all referees in NSW.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

The financial statements cover Judo Federation of Australia (NSW) Incorporated as an individual entity. Judo Federation of Australia (NSW) Inc. is a not for profit association incorporated under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 (NSW).

The functional and presentation currency of Judo Federation of Australia (NSW) Inc. is Australian Dollars.

1. BASIS OF PREPRATION

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements. The committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australasian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The depreciable amount of all plant and equipment is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Impairment of Non-Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period the Association determines whether there is an evidence of an impairment indicator for non-financial assets.

Where this indicator exists and regardless for goodwill, indefinite life intangible assets and intangible assets not yet available for use, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

Where assets do not operate independently of other assets, the recoverable amount of the relevant cash-generating unit (CGU) is estimated.

The recoverable amount of an asset or CGU is the higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and the value in use. Value in use is the present value of the future cash flows expected to be derived from an asset or cash-generating unit.

Where the recoverable amount is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in the profit or loss.

Reversal indicators are considered in subsequent periods for all assets which have suffered an impairment loss, except for goodwill.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2023

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period. If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Revenue from training services is generally recognised once the training has been delivered.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the balance sheet.
