# CHAIR REPORT

Firstly, thank you again to the membership for your trust in the Board to run Judo NSW to benefit our members. It is a responsibility the Board does not take lightly, and we hope our stewardship during the year has helped to consolidate the organisation and address the challenges we experienced post-pandemic.

## MANAGEMENT & GOVERNANCE

Greg Helm has firmly consolidated his management of the organisation, and his experience in sports management has helped us navigate the increasing governance demands placed on all state sporting organisations. Most of this activity is not evident to our members; however, the weight of bureaucracy accompanying running an SSO is not easy. Maintaining our status as an SSO and obtaining the (small) funding from the state government requires far more hoops than in previous years, and these demands are only increasing. As an organisation, we need to adapt to these changing requirements, and some constitutional changes will be necessary in the coming years to meet these demands.



Along with local demands, as a member organisation of a federated sport, we also have obligations at a national level to ensure our sport flourishes across Australia. The work that occurs alongside Judo Australia and other state judo organisations to ensure our sport benefits in the broader picture also goes largely unnoticed by our members. More and more, local funding programs flow down from national programs, so gone are the days when SSOs and the NSOs can work in isolation.

Beyond funding, child protection and equity issues play a significant role in running any sporting organisation with increased scrutiny and accountability for all. This also extends to the club level; all clubs must know their obligations to comply. If you're unsure how these issues impact your club, please contact Greg in the first instance for advice.

## **OUR PERFORMANCE**

The 2023-24 year was a time of prioritisation and fiscal responsibility for Judo NSW. Coming out of the pandemic has put a financial strain on individuals, families and businesses/organisations.

Unfortunately, Judo NSW was not immune to this, so the Board needed to make some hard decisions. To maintain members' assets, we needed to increase our fees (to pass on an increase in capitation fees) and consider how we ran our flagship event, the Sydney International. Change of any sort is often difficult, and we deeply debate and thoroughly consider the implications for our members of any decision we make.

The decision to increase our fees this year was a hotly debated topic, and we appreciate the time clubs took to come and hear why we needed to take this action. We understand it wouldn't be a popular choice, and we appreciate the clubs supporting the decision by continuing to enrol their members in Judo NSW. Sadly, we also know that some clubs choose not to enrol some members with Judo NSW. This affects those who do pay as they effectively support those who don't. Clubs are reminded that, constitutionally, to be a member club, they must register all members with Judo NSW. If you have hardship cases within your club, please contact Greg to discuss how Judo NSW could help support these members.

Whilst our membership numbers haven't grown, we haven't seen a dramatic decline in response to the fee increase. We appreciate our members' understanding in accommodating this increase in their budgets, which we know are already stretched. This support allows us to continue to provide a 'community' across the sport, ensuring club coaches are skilled and knowledgeable to teach judo and providing opportunities and activities across the community that individual clubs would struggle to provide. Once again, it was great to see the number of coaches gaining their accreditation grow, new referees coming into service, and more members testing their abilities in varying levels of competition.

## **OUR UNSUNG HEROES**

I want to thank all those members – and non-members – who continue to give their time generously. Whether helping to administer the sport, providing opportunities for members to learn or train, or helping out at one of our tournaments, your contribution doesn't go unnoticed, and we couldn't have done it without you.

This year, I would like to highlight a particular group's efforts. For members who have ever attended a monthly development session or have been in the state team at nationals, you will have noticed a dedicated group of coaches who give their time to help others, irrespective of which club the members belong to. We want to take this opportunity to thank all past coaches for their contributions to Judo NSW.

Over the past couple of years, Judo NSW has been succession planning to build the 'next generation' of coaches dedicated to state activities. Anyone attending this year will have noticed several new faces and different ways of running our state training sessions. The scope of these activities has widened – they aren't just about performance but are also about participation and retention. We want to thank our current coaches for stepping up, being open to trying new things, giving selflessly to our athletes, and continuing these activities on behalf of Judo NSW. Any members who would like to be involved in these sessions are welcome to attend – club coaches and athletes alike.

Beyond coaches, we are always willing to help our community build new skills and gain new experiences in a voluntary capacity. We certainly value the help, so if you are in the market to build new skills, please speak to your local club or Judo NSW, and we'll happily provide opportunities for you to grow.

## **KEY EVENTS**

Congratulations to our Olympian and Paralympian for Paris 2024. After bouncing back from several injuries in recent years, Josh Katz from Budokan Judo Club qualified for his second Olympic Games in the men's U60kg division. With his usual tenacity and determination, Josh qualified along with two other Australian athletes to compete in Paris. Taylor Gosens from Zenbu Judo Club qualified for her first Paralympic Games in the women's +70kg J2 division. Taylor was Australia's only competitor at the Paralympics. Judo NSW congratulates both athletes on their achievements in representing Australia at such prestigious events.

The Sydney International Open in 2024 saw over 400 competitors compete. The overarching aim was to provide a tournament that allowed competitors to be at their best whilst balancing the need to run the event with fiscal responsibility. Finding venues in Sydney is challenging; appropriate facilities, availability, and cost are all proving more elusive; therefore, a different venue was utilised to manage costs, which also meant going back to a two-day format for the competition. Judo NSW continued with our Community Series events. These events continued to see a growing number of competitors entering their first competition. They continued to allow a broader group of members to be involved beyond their club and meet and compete against players from other clubs.

It's heartening to see new and repeat members eager to participate and represent their state at the National Championships each year. Watching an athlete develop resilience and tenacity during the lead into the tournament is an achievement in itself. It's easy to focus only on results and forget the many other outcomes of participating in these activities. Being a part of a 'team' in an individual sport is a unique opportunity, and it's terrific to see the athletes come together and support one another in this environment.

## **OUR FUTURE**

Our organisational mandate continues to provide services to our members – clubs, athletes, and officials. Judo NSW recognises this mandate to provide these services that require the consolidated 'weight' of a state body whilst ensuring we balance this with the responsibility of protecting and growing member assets. As a Board, we continue to manage the organisation to ensure the sport is governed responsibly, can grow, and provides value to all members.

# CEO REPORT

The past year has been one of consolidation and strategic focus for Judo NSW, as we tightened spending while continuing to deliver key events and services for our members. Despite the economic challenges, we are pleased to report solid member engagement, strong event participation, and a positive financial outcome.

I would like to acknowledge the dedication of those who continue to play their part to ensure that the sport of Judo continues to tick in NSW. From the Board of Directors, led by our Chair Belinda McIndoe, all Club Coaches who deliver the sport on a daily basis, referees, volunteers and members of all ages and the wider Judo community, I thank you all for making the sport what it is.

Thank you to Bjorn Tandean who has taken on the Administration Assistant role with Judo NSW and has assisted greatly in the delivery of events and member services in his first few months.

## Events and Member Engagement

Our events were well attended throughout the year, with standout numbers at the Sydney International, State Championships, and our Community Series events. Notably, we expanded our reach with a successful regional Community Series event held in Coffs Harbour, which helped strengthen our connection with members on the North Coast. These events provided valuable opportunities for judoka of all levels to participate and showcase their skills, and the Community Series in particular, introduced many to competition judo for the first time.

# CEO REPORT *Continued*

## **NSW State Squad/HP Program**

A major focus this year was the continued development of our High Performance (HP) program, led by the dedicated NSW State Coaching Team. The HP program is critical to ensuring that we field a well-prepared team of athletes and coaches for the National Championships, and this year saw significant progress in both athlete preparation and program delivery.

Our State Squad initiatives included:

- A Futures Camp targeting athletes aged 12-15, which served as a developmental pathway for juniors preparing to transition into the cadet and higher divisions.
- Kata and Shiai State Camps aimed at providing intensive technical and tactical training for athletes gearing up for the National Championships
- A 6 week NSW Squad Training program leading up to the National Championships, ensuring that our athletes were in peak condition.
- Monthly HP squad training sessions, delivered by our experienced State Coaches, to maintain ongoing development and high-level conditioning for our top athletes.
- These initiatives have strengthened the depth of talent in our athlete pool and reinforced Judo NSW's commitment to fostering excellence at all levels of competition.

A big thank you to Head Coaches Kylie Koenig and Joe Costanzo and mentor Sue Williams for leading the NSW State Coaching Team over the year, and our Kata Coaches Ernie Wakamatsu and Dale Keough.

## **Financial Performance**

On the financial front, I am pleased to report an improved result in FY24. This is largely in part to the following factors.

- An increase in membership fees contributing to additional revenue, but offset against an increase in affiliation fees paid to Judo Australia which incorporated insurance costs.
- Implementation of an investment strategy which led to an additional \$6K in revenue through Term Deposit interest.
- We were able to secure increased government support through the OSP funding program, which rose from \$15,000 to \$40,000 this year – the first increase since 2000.
- Tournaments expenses were reduced by \$40K.

## **Other Highlights**

- The Sport NSW Distinguished Long Service Award to Warren Rosser and Order of Australia Medal to Kerrye Katz acknowledging both of their outstanding contributions to the sport of Judo.
- Sarah Bailey and Levi Lipman each receiving \$1000 to assist in their athlete journey through the Commonwealth Games NSW athlete Grant program.
- Diego Barreto winning gold at the IJF Veterans World Championships in Abu Dhabi.
- The excitement of watching NSW athletes Josh Katz and Taylor Gosens compete at the Paris Olympics and Paralympics respectively and the ability to showcase our sport with a number of various media opportunities.

In closing, I want to thank the entire Judo NSW community for your continued support and dedication. Together, we will achieve our vision of a thriving Judo community in New South Wales. I look forward to the journey ahead and am excited about the incredible potential that lies before us.

# NSW KATA COMMISSION

In general, the Judo NSW Kata team did well this year lead by Dale Keogh and Ernie Wakamatsu as State Coaches with Eddie Yuen as manager. The team put an emphasis on adding new young talent to the team. Unfortunately, many competitors were unable to compete fully due to injuries and illnesses. From the National Kata Championships, Judo NSW took away six medals, including two Gold medals:

## **Referee Training Program**

We continued to support club-based referee training and rules clarifications, though to a lesser extent this year. We supported referee training and mentoring. We conducted a successful practical and video seminar to discuss various difficult situations and current developments ahead of the Sydney Open.

Our referee commission also attended state squad training ahead of the nationals and an ongoing state training program to clarify the application of rules.

As always, the Judo NSW Referee Commission's key focus has been providing training in various refereeing areas. We combined training and mentoring to establish consistency, uplift capability, and develop a new generation of referees.

We look forward to continuing this program and developing an outcome-oriented training and development strategy.
